

Fall Management - An Interdisciplinary Approach

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This full-day, interactive seminar focuses on the importance of the interdisciplinary approach to manage fall risk and falls. Discussion will include: falls statistics and what that means to your organization, intrinsic/extrinsic fall risk factors, root cause analysis, the impact of cognition on fall/fall risk and the development of individualized interventions based on interdisciplinary team (IDT) assessments. Group examination of case studies will facilitate discussion, problem solving and provide the opportunity for the sharing of best practices.

Program Objectives

By completion of this session, learner will be able to:

- Identify members of the IDT falls management team and methods of effective communication and collaboration necessary for the development of patient-specific, individualized interventions.
- Discuss the complexity of the older adult and multifactorial fall risk factors.
- Recall both intrinsic and extrinsic fall factors and identify appropriate disciplines (PT, OT, ST) necessary to evaluate and treat identified areas impacting fall/fall risk.
- Demonstrate impact of cognition on falls/fall risk and develop appropriate interventions/strategies.
- Develop and implement an effective, individualized plan based on assessments.

Judy Freyermuth is a graduate of Marquette University and has 36 years of clinical and operational experience, working with all ages in a variety of settings. She was the therapist for the Muscular Dystrophy Clinic in Southeastern, MA, for 11 years, where she gained extensive experience in wheelchair seating/positioning manual and powered mobility. She gained additional experience in the area of seating and positioning through work with brain injured children and also at a day habilitation program for cognitively impaired adults. She has been employed by RehabCare (Rehab Division of Kindred Healthcare) for the past 26 years where she has worked primarily in skilled nursing facilities with geriatrics. As a member of the clinical services team for the past 15 years, Judy has provided extensive education in the areas of seating and positioning, falls/restraints, cognition and various other clinical topics across the country. Judy was lead in the development of RehabCare's Steady Steps Fall Management Program. As part of this program, she has provided extensive IDT, nursing, nursing assistant and rehab training in falls management. She has also presented/co-presented International Seating Symposium and for two years at the APTA Combined Sections Conference. She is a former secretary for the Assistive Technology/Seating and Wheeled Mobility SIG, under the Neuro Section of the APTA.
