

## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Assessment, documentation and interventions for prevention and management of chronic wounds in the PAC/LTC environment is challenging for many reasons including, but not limited to; the population (older and/or more fragile), the regulations, reimbursement changes and clinical knowledge challenges by direct care staff. These reasons and more can make wound management in PAC/LTC demanding for building management, leadership, and clinical and support staff. This program will integrate clinical best practices with regulatory (survey) mandates for wound prevention and care, <a href="mailto:including coding the MDS">including coding the MDS</a>, <a href="mailto:section-M">Section-M</a>, which will <a href="mailto:drive-reimbursement under the Patient Driven Payment Model (PDPM)</a>) and <a href="mailto:prevention-from a system's perspective for compliance with the mandated Quality Assurance and Performance Improvement (QAPI)</a>. This information-packed program provides attendees with up-to-date information to assist clinical teams, building management and leadership with tools and direction for creating functional wound prevention and care programs that meets today's highly regulated environment for PAC/LTC. The program is appropriate for DON/ADON, administrators, treatment nurses, PT/OTs, MDS coordinators and others responsible for leading, supervising, or providing care related to wound prevention and management in the PAC/LTC setting.

- Describe current treatment interventions for chronic wounds including: debridement, topical therapies, and biophysical agents (e.g. NPWT, E-Stim).
- Participate in wound characteristics, coding, documentation and reporting recognition skills lab.
- · List resources to assist in framing your wound prevention and management program.
- Fill out patient/wound evaluation form and trade for certificate of completion.
